Students engage in comprehensive learning, including nutritional management, meal planning, and production management, with hands-on experience at designated school lunch facilities. They also develop presentation skills to effectively contribute as members of healthcare teams.

DIVISION OF MIDWIFERY



This program trains self-reliant specialists dedicated to nurturing life and enhancing maternal and child health in the community. Students develop essential skills to ensure safe and healthy childbirth, along with the knowledge to address women's health issues and contemporary parent-child challenges. They also learn to collaborate effectively in team-based medical care and engage with the broader community.
