Symbol

Introduced in 2003, our university symbol features four petals representing our four educational principles. The design subtly forms a "Y" for Yamaguchi Prefectural University and evokes images of cherry blossoms, representing our campus in *Sakurabatake*.



Emblem

Our university emblem, created in 1975, features the kanji for "university" within the outline of the *Yata no Kagami*, a sacred mirror from Japanese mythology. The *dai* character symbolizes a soaring bird, representing the university's aspirations and future growth.



Mascot

Our mascot *Y-Piyo* is a Java sparrow with cherry blossom-shaped wings and a red bandana in our school colors. Born on May 15th, *Y-Piyo* loves Yamaguchi's famous *uirou* sweets. The name combines "YPU" (Yamaguchi Prefectural University) with "piyo," the chirping sound of a bird.

Establishment of Yamaguchi Prefectural Women's College (Faculty of Literature and Faculty of Home Economics)

1991

Reorganization of the Faculty of Home Economics

1994

Reorganization of the Faculty of Literature (Faculty of Intercultural Studies and Faculty of Social Welfare Established)

1996

Name changed from Yamaguchi Women's College to Yamaguchi Prefectural University; implementation of co-educational system; establishment of the Faculty of Nursing

1998

Faculty of Home Economics becomes Faculty of Life Sciences

1999

Establishment of the Graduate School (Graduate Program in Intercultural Studies and Graduate Program in Social Welfare)

2006

Name Changed to Public University Corporation Yamaguchi Prefectural University; establishment of the Health Welfare Department and the Graduate Program of Health Welfare (Doctoral)

2007

Reorganization of the Faculty of Intercultural Studies, Faculty of Life Sciences, and Faculty of Nursing; establishment of the Department of Culture and Creative Arts in the Faculty of Intercultural Studies; establishment of the Faculty of Nursing and Nutrition

2012

Establishment of the Special Graduate Program of Midwifery

2025

Establishment of the Department of Information Society Studies in the Faculty of Intercultural Studies
